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#### 1. Qualitative Information on Quarterly Consolidated Financial Results

#### (1) Operating results

#### Consolidation period and comparative information due to the change in fiscal year-end

Effective from the fiscal year ended December 31, 2024, the fiscal year-end (the closing date of the fiscal year) of the Company has been changed from March 31 to December 31 every year. The fiscal year ended December 31, 2024, a transitional period to implement the change in the fiscal year-end, ran for nine months (April 1–December 31, 2024) for Daifuku Co., Ltd. and its subsidiaries in Japan, while subsidiaries outside of Japan had a 12-month accounting period (January 1–December 31, 2024). Accordingly, quarterly consolidated financial statements for the first three quarters of the fiscal year ended December 2024 have not been prepared. Therefore, a comparative analysis with the same period of the fiscal year ended December 31, 2024 has not been conducted.

During the first three quarters of the fiscal year ending December 31, 2025, the global economy generally remained favorable, although uncertainty increased due to the impact of US trade policy and downside risks associated with the sluggish Chinese economy.

Looking at the business environment for the manufacturing and distribution sectors in Japan and the United States, investment in automation at manufacturing and logistics sites is recovering against the backdrop of labor shortages and substantially higher labor costs. In the semiconductor industry, strong demand for advanced semiconductor investment including automation in back-end processes continues, supported by increasing demand for AI applications. In China, investment continues in line with efforts to strengthen and promote domestic production. In the automotive industry, while customers have delayed investment decisions as they await the impact of tariffs, a high level of investment continued to be planned, mainly in the United States. Meanwhile, demand for investment in automation at airports to meet the increase in the number of air passengers continues, particularly in the United States and certain other countries.

In this economic and business environment, during the first three quarters of the fiscal year, orders for automotive systems were sluggish, while orders for intralogistics systems from manufacturers and distributors, cleanroom systems from the semiconductor sectors, and airport systems remained steady. Sales remained strong, supported by a favorable performance in intralogistics systems, cleanroom systems, and automotive systems, which benefiting from an extensive order backlog at the end of the previous fiscal year.

Specifically, the Group received orders of 499,040 million yen, and recorded sales of 486,014 million yen.

In terms of profits, the profit margin remained at a high level due to cost reductions achieved through production efficiency improvements and enhanced project management, as well as a focus on securing orders with strong profitability.

Consequently, the Group posted operating income of 75,214 million yen, and ordinary income of 77,556 million yen. Net income attributable to shareholders of the parent company was 58,468 million yen. These results already exceed the record-high results of the previous fiscal year, which included operating income of 71,546 million yen, ordinary income of 74,498 million yen, and net income attributable to shareholders of the parent company of 57,086 million yen.

The average exchange rates used for transactions during the first three quarters of the fiscal year were 147.91 yen to the U.S. dollar, 20.49 yen to the Chinese yuan, 0.1047 yen to the Korean won, and 4.75 yen to the New Taiwan dollar.

#### Impact and response to U.S. trade policy, etc.

The United States is one of our priority markets, accounting for 123.9 billion yen in net sales and composition ratio of 26% for the first three quarters of the fiscal year ending December 31, 2025 (167.7 billion yen and composition ratio of 30% for the previous fiscal year).

While some products and components sourced from outside the United States will be subject to tariffs introduced by the United States, most of the intralogistics systems, automotive systems, and airport systems are produced in the United States. In addition, cleanroom systems are manufactured in Japan, Taiwan, and South Korea and exported to the United States, with the majority of contracts being with customers as importers. For this reason, the tariffs incurred by the Group are extremely limited.

However, U.S. trade policy may affect the future investment plans (country, amount, and timing) of our customers, particularly those in the automotive and semiconductor industries. We will redouble efforts to deepen communication with our customers and make optimal proposals that utilize the Group's global network for investment plans, thereby securing orders.

In addition, the Group has positioned the United States as a priority market, and increasing production capacity for systems for intralogistics systems in the country had become an urgent priority. In October 2025, a new factory was completed and has commenced operations. As a result, production capacity will increase to approximately double the previous capacity. We are strengthening our order acquisition activities in anticipation of increased production capacity, aiming to increase sales and expand our market share in the U.S. market by taking advantage of our strengths in local self-sufficiency.

#### Results by reportable segment

Results by reportable segment are described below. Orders from and sales to external customers are presented as segment orders and sales, and net income attributable to shareholders of the parent company is recorded as segment income. For more details about reportable segments, please see the "Segment information, etc." below.

#### Daifuku Co., Ltd.

Orders for automotive systems were affected by delays in customer investment decisions on certain projects.

Sales were strong in cleanroom systems and automotive systems, which benefited from an extensive order backlog from the end of the previous fiscal year.

Segment income remained at a high level due to cost reductions achieved through production efficiency improvements and enhanced project management, as well as a focus on securing orders with strong profitability.

As a result, the Company recorded orders of 163,141 million yen, sales of 193,412 million yen, and segment income of 44,573 million yen.

#### Contec Co., Ltd. and its subsidiaries (Contec)

Orders remained steady overall, although results in North America were sluggish due to the absence of the large-scale order in the airport security sector recorded in the previous year.

Sales were favorable, driven by a steady performance in the medical sector in North America.

Segment income remained firm, supported by improved profitability in the Japanese market.

As a result, Contec posted orders of 14,243 million yen, sales of 14,964 million yen, and segment income of 942 million yen.

#### Daifuku North America, Inc. and its subsidiaries (Daifuku North America)

Orders for intralogistics systems and airport systems remained favorable, while orders for cleanroom systems and automotive systems were sluggish.

Sales for intralogistics systems remained favorable, supported by an extensive order backlog at the end of the previous fiscal year, although sales fell due to a review of certain operations.

Segment income remained at a high level due to cost reductions achieved through production efficiency improvements and enhanced project management, as well as a focus on securing orders with strong profitability.

As a result, Daifuku North America received orders of 159,193 million yen, sales of 120,595 million yen, and segment income of 12,111 million yen.

#### Clean Factomation, Inc.

Orders remained steady, driven by an expansion in advanced semiconductor investments for AI applications.

Sales and segment income were favorable, underpinned by an order backlog from the end of the previous fiscal year.

As a result, Clean Factomation posted orders of 40,691 million yen, sales of 28,465 million yen, and segment income of 2,663 million yen.

#### Daifuku (Suzhou) Cleanroom Automation Co., Ltd.

Orders remained generally steady, supported by continued investment in line with efforts to strengthen and promote domestic production.

Sales and segment income are affected by a decrease in the order backlog.

As a result, Daifuku (Suzhou) Cleanroom Automation posted orders of 22,431 million yen, sales of 29,543 million yen, and segment income of 8,094 million yen.

#### Other

The Group has a total of 61 consolidated subsidiaries worldwide. The Other segment includes all consolidated subsidiaries excluding the aforementioned Contec, Daifuku North America, Clean Factomation, and Daifuku (Suzhou) Cleanroom Automation. These companies manufacture, sell, install, and service material handling systems, car wash machines, and other equipment. The status of major subsidiaries is as follows.

#### Japan subsidiaries

Daifuku Plusmore Co., Ltd. provides car wash machines and related services.

#### Subsidiaries outside of Japan

The Group has production sites for material handling systems and car wash machines in China, Taiwan, South Korea, Thailand, India, and other regions, which also provide sales, installations, and services, playing a role in creating an optimal local production and procurement framework.

In addition, the Group has subsidiaries in North America, Asia, Europe, and Oceania, which provide sales, installation, and services.

Orders remained strong, mainly in cleanroom systems, driven by an expansion in advanced semiconductor investments for AI applications.

Sales and segment income also remained strong, particularly in cleanroom systems, underpinned by an extensive order backlog from the end of the previous fiscal year.

As a result, the segment recorded orders of 99,338 million yen, sales of 99,203 million yen, and segment income of 9,288 million yen.

#### (2) Financial position

#### Assets, liabilities and net assets

Assets stood at 707,014 million yen, an increase of 18,307 million yen from the end of the previous fiscal year. The result principally reflected increases of 15,075 million yen in notes receivable, accounts receivable from completed construction contracts and other, and contract assets, and 11,894 million yen in property, plant and equipment, offsetting a decrease of 5,461 million yen in raw materials and supplies.

Liabilities amounted to 285,474 million yen, a decrease of 4,807 million yen from the end of the previous fiscal year. Primary factors included a decrease of 14,541 million yen in contract liabilities, offsetting increases of 7,209 million yen in income taxes payable and 2,746 million yen in other current liabilities such as accrued expenses.

Net assets were 421,540 million yen, an increase of 23,115 million yen from the end of the previous fiscal year. This was mainly attributable to an increase of 34,170 million yen in retained earnings, offsetting a decrease of 8,433 million yen in foreign currency translation adjustments.

#### Cash flows

Cash and cash equivalents during the first three quarters of the fiscal year decreased 294 million yen from the end of the previous fiscal year, to 220.1 billion yen.

#### Cash flows from operating activities

Cash provided by operating activities totaled 45,679 million yen. This was mainly attributable to increases of 18,399 million yen in notes and accounts receivables and contract assets and 17,046 million yen in income taxes paid, partially offset by 81,456 million yen in income before income taxes.

# Cash flows from investing activities

Cash used in investing activities was 14,333 million yen. Major factors included 6,474 million yen for investments in time deposits and 18,816 million yen for payments for the purchase of property, plant and equipment, outweighing 5,468 million yen of proceeds from sales of investments in securities and 5 billion yen of proceeds from redemption of investments in securities.

#### Cash flows from financing activities

Cash used in financing activities was 26,008 million yen. This was mainly attributable to payments of cash dividends of 23,384 million yen.

#### (3) Outlook

In light of recent business performance trends, the Company has revised upward its consolidated full-year earnings forecast for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2025, which was announced on August 7, 2025, as follows.

Sales are progressing as almost planned, underpinned by an extensive order backlog from the end of the previous fiscal year. Income is meanwhile expected to exceed the previous forecast, which was announced on August 7, 2025, mainly due to cost reductions achieved through production efficiency improvements and enhanced project management, as well as a focus on securing orders with strong profitability. The impact of U.S. tariff policies has been reflected in the earnings forecast. An exchange rate for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2025 of 148 yen to the U.S. dollar is unchanged from the beginning of the fiscal year.

In addition, given the favorable results, the Company has revised its year-end dividend for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2025 to 42 yen per share, an increase of 8 yen. Accordingly, the annual dividend per share is projected to be 76 yen.
